Africa's Golden Moment Has Come

The light has been passed on to our generation. The Nigerian Diaspora should provide the following four visions.

First, Nigeria is 50 years old. In 50 more years, it will be the world's third-most-populous nation, behind only China and India. Seventeen of Africa's 53 nations are 50 years old. In 50 more years, Africa could become the world's most populous region, ahead of China.

Second, Diasporan technologists should become the nation's sounding board. Nigeria's oil wells will dry up in 50 years, according to industry insiders. It's an uncomfortable truth that we must examine. We must explore "a Nigeria without oil."

Third, the Nigerian Diaspora must paint the big picture. Without oil, Nigeria's 50-year-projected 400 million people will have to focus on their technological and intellectual capital to compete globally. If couples continue to bear an average of three children, Nigeria is certain to tip the scales

of any future global population census.

Fourth, the Nigerian Diaspora should help the nation master new terrain. Nigeria's president and state governors are on the front line fighting fires every day. People expect them to have all the answers for the next 50 years for 150 to 400 million Nigerians.

The Nigerian Diaspora is a planet-sized think tank, which will allow leaders inside Nigeria to move beyond their collective limits and master new terrains.

The brain drain is Africa's cold civil war that could leave the continent empty of brains in 50 years. Its effect on Nigeria of the twenty-first century could be worse than the Nigerian-Biafran civil war of the twentieth century.

Governor Emmanuel Eweta Uduaghan organized this conference to link link Deltans abroad to their brothers and sisters in Nigeria. Doing so will increase his peoples intellectual

capital which, in turn, will bring greater developments to Delta state.

My advice to Africans in the Diaspora is this: Africa needs your vision far more than your knowledge. Africa has more teachers than visionaries but need more visionaries than teachers. The teacher has his feet on the ground, and his eyes on the ground. The visionary has her feet on the ground, but kept her eyes on the stars. The teacher drives, while the visionary leads by speaking loudly and carrying big ideas. You should go beyond teaching and provide vision and direction.

Your visionary lectures should be more mystery than mastery and you should be more charismatic than cosmetic and your focus should be on the mythical and eternal truths.

We must connect our children to the past and give them the wisdom they need to face the future. A long time ago, a man asked his children:

“If you had a choice between the clay of wisdom or a bag of gold, which would you choose?”

“The bag of gold, the bag of gold,” the naïve children cried, not realizing that wisdom had the potential to earn them many more bags of gold in the future.

The wealth of the future will be derived from developing the intellectual capital—the clay of wisdom—the innovations of the younger generation that will make Nigeria stronger.

We must put faith on our young generation as we look to the future. By reinvesting our petroleum revenues into developing the potential of our children, we free ourselves from the burdens of our past.

The future is for us to create, but first we must outline our vision. Foot soldiers, not generals, will lead our war against ignorance. The foot soldiers are our one hundred million young Nigerians whose weapon is knowledge. Their collective intellectual capital will enable them to improve the world and push the human race forward.

My vision is for Nigeria to tap into the creativity and innovation of our young people-the people who have the potential to uplift humanity.

Technology is all around us; inventing new tools, techniques, and technologies reaffirms humanity's goal to endlessly search for new knowledge, and to demand more of itself and its people.

Let's do the best we can to make the world better through technology. It is a pleasure to be in Geneva, Switzerland and an honor to address this conference of Deltans in the Diaspora.
